The Organization was first recognized as a non-profit association in 2004 by the Ministerial Decree N° 51/11 of the 04/05/2004 with the mission of promoting the wellbeing of uncared and other vulnerable children through social and civic integration.

In 2013, the organization underwent institutional restructuring to comply with the existing law in the country

Since 11/12/2013, OEPESED TABARA is legally operating in Rwanda as NGO that has fulfilled all requirement for compliance with the new law number 04/12 of 17/02/2012 governing the organization and the functioning of

national NGOs. It has been involved in both humanitarian and development assistance to support children and other people under critical circumstances including orphans, children with disabilities and those from poor families.

Our Approach: The HEAL Model

For Comprehensive Development; we promote resilience and sustainability through the HEAL Model, focusing on **Health, Education, and Advanced Livelihood.**

We prioritize active community participation to identify and address local challenges (Community-Centered Solutions)

We emphasize the importance of local volunteer efforts in driving meaningful change.

We encourage ownership and long-term impact through collaborative, locally-driven initiatives.

Our Programs



1. Health program

Under health program we provide care, support, funding and education to improve health for everyone.



It focuses on SRHR for adolescents and youth, addressing GBV, FP, and HIV/STI prevention.



We constructed and equipped Gitovu Health Center in Burera district to serve over 2,300 people with SRHR services, including HIV prevention and response.



We have over 60 peer educators who were trained in the Peer Education Model.



More than 16,570 adolescents and young people received SRHR information and services.



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2. Livelihood Program

We enhance the resilience and sustainability of SRHR by strengthening vulnerable families through economic empowerment.

Trained 1,257 households in sisal farming for income generation and landslide prevention.

Provided 78 families with cows and 23 children with disabilities with goats in Musanze District.

Developed "INTWATWA" traditional dance, empowering 391 individuals and creating income opportunities through performances.

Delivered training on SRH, hygiene, and financial resilience, improving living conditions.

Boosted women's income, enabling better family support, education, and cultural connectivity.

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3. Education program

- We advocate for inclusive education and supports vulnerable children access to quality education.
- Supported Vulnerable Children, where 1,235 children were provided with school materials and 213 secondary students supported with school fees.
- Reached 2,308 adults through adult literacy program
- Established 12 Early Childhood Centers (ECD)
- Reintegrated 116 street children into families, where 28 children supported with income-generating starter packages.
